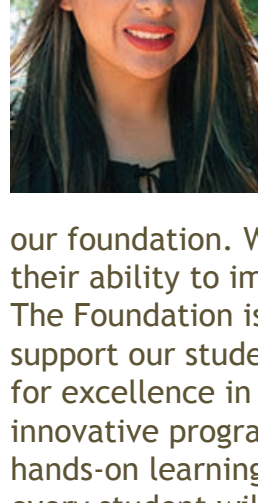


From the Executive Director

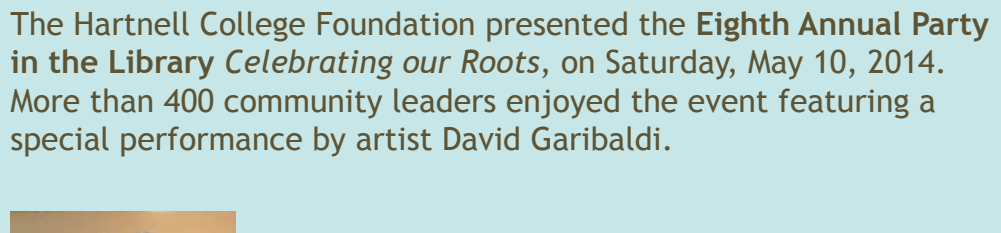

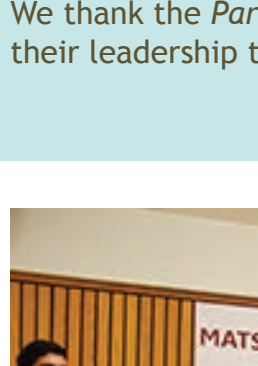

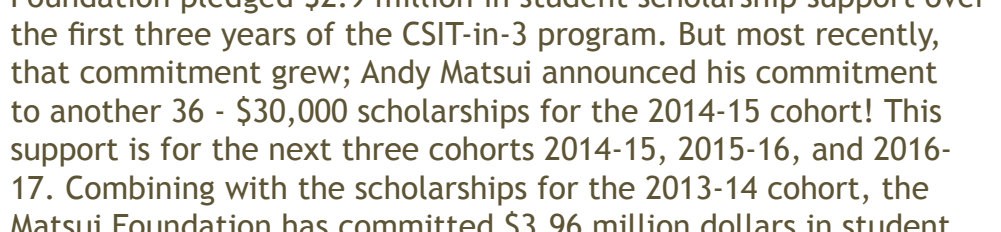

Hartnell student Roberto Ornelas received the surprise of his life when presented with a \$5,000 scholarship to assist with his continued success in attaining his bachelor's degree.

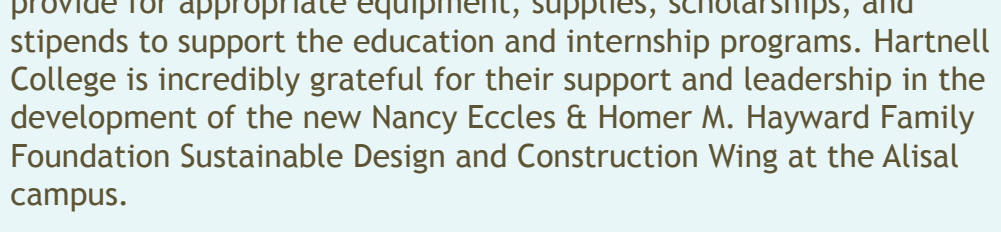

Unprecedented support for students in CSIT-in-3 from The Matsui Foundation

In an unprecedented show of philanthropic support, the Matsui Foundation pledged \$2.9 million in student scholarship support over the first three years of the CSIT-in-3 program. But most recently, that commitment grew; Andy Matsui announced his commitment to another 36 - \$30,000 scholarships for the 2014-15 cohort! This support is for the next three cohorts 2014-15, 2015-16, and 2016-17. Combining with the scholarships for the 2013-14 cohort, the Matsui Foundation has committed \$3.96 million dollars in student scholarships! At the cusp of innovation

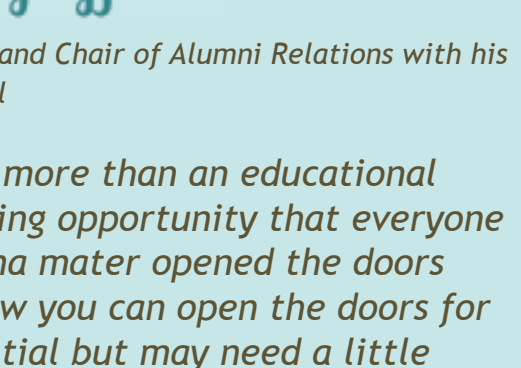
The Nancy Eccles & Homer M. Hayward Family Foundation

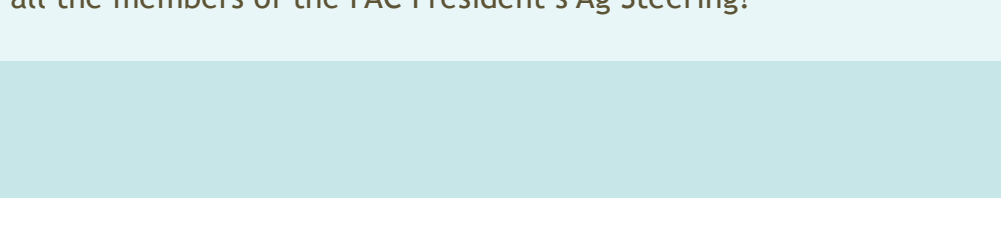

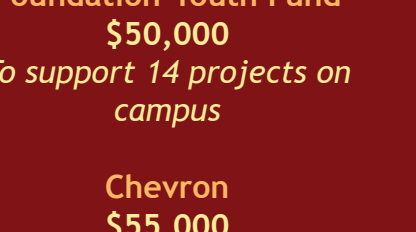

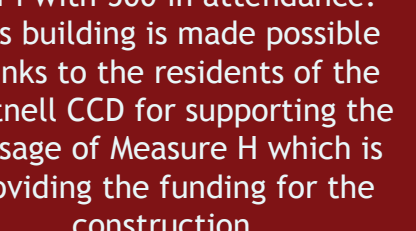


Hartnell employees have heart

Western Food Safety Summit

More than 230 attended the Western Food Safety Summit held on May 8 & 9, 2014 presented by the Hartnell Ag Business and Technology Institute. The theme was **Responsible Leadership in Food Safety**, focused on the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) expected to be implemented in 2015. The guest speakers covered topics on food safety practices including training requirements for FSMA, elements of risk analysis program, FDA investigations, legal consequences, treatment and irrigation water, food borne investigation, biofilm and pathogens, organic standards, plus more.

The summit included a poster session and representatives from University of California, University of Arizona, University of Florida, and Monterey County Health Department. The event closed with a panel discussion with representatives from California Leafy Green Products Handler Marketing Agreement, Produce Marketing Association, Church Brothers, and UC Davis.

STEM Center coming soon!

The Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new Science Center Building was a hit on April 24, 2014 with 500 in attendance. This building is made possible thanks to the residents of the Hartnell CCD for supporting the passage of Measure H which is providing the funding for the construction.

The building will provide 54,000 square feet to contain six lecture spaces, ten laboratories, and the planetarium. The building will support Hartnell's efforts to be a leader in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education. The new building is scheduled to open for the spring semester 2016.
