BACKGROUND / SUMMARY

Hartnell College applied for a Phase I planning grant from the Irvine Foundation - Bridging the Gap Initiative. The goals of the proposal are to exemplify how K-12 and postsecondary partners work together to ensure a smooth transition to postsecondary for high school graduates, with an emphasis on Linked Learning pathway students; and engage in Bridging the Gap Phase I planning activities to prepare for a successful application for Phase II implementation.

The outcomes of the planning project include: MOU's outlining commitments, roles and responsibilities of partner organizations; a shared understanding of the current capacity related to the partnership effort; an accurate demographic and educational profile of the region's student population and that of the target population; and a concrete project plan for implementing the Bridging the Gap framework and strategies to accomplish an increase in Math and English college ready students and a shared Student Momentum Database for K-12, community college and university partners to collect and analyze student data and partnership progress.
