BACKGROUND / SUMMARY

California Career Pathways Trust funds in the amount of \$250 million will be made available to school districts, county superintendents of schools, direct-funded charter schools, regional occupational centers or programs operated by a joint powers authority, and community college districts for kindergarten through grade fourteen career pathways programs that accomplish: specialists in work-based learning; establish regional collaborative relationships with business entities and community organizations; develop and integrate standards-based academics aligned to high-need, high-growth or emerging economic sectors; provide articulated pathways; and leverage and build on Perkins resources, matching resources, sector strategies and CCC skills panel.

The following pathways were proposed in the Letter of Intent to Apply
Agriculture and Natural Resources - Agri-science
Building and Construction Trades - Residential and Commercial
Health Science and Medical Technology - Patient Care
Information and Communication Technologies - Information Support and Services
Public Services - Legal Practices

Competitive priorities include: regions with higher-than-state-average rates of high school dropouts; establishing or strengthening legal career pathways (role and operations of state and federal courts); pathways that include both high school opportunities and a postsecondary pathway leading to a community college baccalaureate degree.
